

OFFICIAL CALL
Mass Meeting
of the Page County 4th District Republican Committee
of the Republican Party of Virginia

As Chairman of the Page County Committee of the Republican Party, and pursuant to the Plan of Organization and as recommended and directed by the Committee, I, Jonathan B. Comer, do hereby issue this call for a Mass Meeting to be held at the Page County Circuit Courtroom, located at 116 S. Court St., Luray, VA 22835 and shall begin promptly at 6:30 PM local time on August 10, 2010 for the following purpose:

Nominating a Republican candidate for the office of 4th District Supervisor to be voted for in the special election on November 2, 2010;

Qualifications for Participation

All legal and qualified voters of Page County's 4th magisterial district under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, regardless of race, religion, national origin or sex, who are in accord with the principles of the Republican Party and who, if requested, express in open meeting either orally or in writing as may be required, their intent to support all of its nominees for public office in the ensuing election, may participate as members of the Republican Party of Virginia in its mass meetings, party canvasses, conventions or primaries encompassing their respective election districts.

Filing Requirements

Candidates for the election or nomination at said mass meeting shall file a written statement by mail or in person, to Jonathan B. Comer, Chairman of the Page County Republican Committee, at 17 West Main Street, Luray, VA 22835, which must be received not later than August 3, 2010 at 4:00 PM (postmarks do not count). A filing fee of \$200.00 payable to the Page County Republican Committee shall accompany this statement.

If only one candidate files by the deadline, the mass meeting will be cancelled and the filed candidate will be declared the Republican nominee.

Registration Fee

There will be a (voluntary) registration fee of \$5.00 to participate in this mass meeting.

Process of the Mass Meeting

The mass meeting will be governed by the most recent Robert's Rules of Order. A majority of all votes cast is required to win. If no candidate receives a majority of the votes on the first ballot, the candidate with the fewest votes will be removed from consideration and a new ballot will be circulated. This process will continue until a majority vote is received. In the event of the tie, another ballot will be circulated.
